Thank you for your liaison statement (ref # 021.01) soliciting Last Call review comments by ITU-T of the MPLS-TP Survivability Framework draft. The experts of Q9/15 have reviewed draft-ietf-mpls-tp-survive-fwk-04.txt by correspondence and in a conference call on 30-03-2010.

The following comments were received:

Concerning the previous liaison #012.02:

We reviewed the response to our liaison #012.02 providing comments on version 02 of this draft. We have noted that a large number of the comments were rejected. We cannot accept this disposition of our comments. In the original liaison we requested that we were give another early review before the draft was submitted for WG last call. This request was ignored, also we did not see any email indicating how the comments were addressed before the simultaneous release of the response liaison and the initiation of the WG last call.

Concerning available time to review:

Several experts have noted that they did not have sufficient time to review this version 04 of this 57 page draft in detail and provided only high level comments or submitted their comments before finishing the full review of the draft. We expect that a more detailed and complete review would uncover many more issues.
