Application process

An application to establish a liaison with an ISO Committee or Working Group shall be submitted by the applicant organization to the secretariat of that committee.

The committee secretariat shall submit a copy of the application to their Technical Programme Manager at ISO Central Secretariat (ISO/CS) for an eligibility check. ISO/CS will also consult with the National Body (NSB) in the country where the applicant organization is based.

If the application is validated by ISO/CS and there is no objection from the relevant NSB, the committee secretariat shall circulate the application in the committee (e.g. via committee internal ballot) to approve the liaison request.

In case of an objection from the NSB, the application will be referred to the ISO Technical Management Board for decision.

Detailed information concerning the general requirements applicable to liaisons, different categories of liaisons, eligibility criteria, rights and obligations of liaison organizations is contained in the [ISO/IEC Directives, Part 1 and Consolidated ISO Supplement, Clause 1.17](#).

Justification for liaison request

Reason for Liaison request

The IETF currently has two working groups, Serialising Extended Data About Times and Events (sedate) (<https://datatracker.ietf.org/wg/sedate/about/>) and Limited Additional Mechanisms for PKIX and SMIME (lamps) (<https://datatracker.ietf.org/wg/lamps/about/>), that work on specifications that are either using ISO specifications or are used by ISO specifications maintained by ISO TC154.

Expected benefits for applicant

The IETF would like to coordinate with ISO TC154 to ensure that the work mentioned above is closely aligned with the work done by ISO. Particularly, ISO 14533 is referencing RFC6960 which was updated by the lamps working group in RFC8954. RFC3339 is a profile of ISO 8601 and will be updated by the sedate working group.

Expected benefits for TC/SC/WG

As the sedate working group will be specifying updates to RFC 3339, close cooperation will help to ensure that updates to the timestamp specification in RFC3339 will remain a profile of current versions of ISO 8601.

Short, medium and long-term goals of liaison

The work of the currently active IETF working groups, sedate and lamps, indicates that the work done in ISO TC 154 is relevant for the IETF and vice versa. Even after the conclusion of these currently active working groups, close coordination is considered beneficial to ensure that existing dependencies are maintained and updated accordingly.


