

# **IANA Services Activity**

Protocol Parameter requests since IETF-100 (October 2017- February 2018)\*

Processed more than 1483 IETF-related requests
This includes: Document reviews, registry creations, new registrations, modifications to existing registrations, and deletions.

- Reviewed 125 I-Ds in Last Call
- Reviewed 117 in IETF Evaluation
- Reviewed 104 documents becoming RFCs (63 of the 104 documents had registry actions of some form)
- Media Types 26
- Ports 37
