



- Project goals:
  - XML as the unchanging, underlying format
  - TXT, PDF/A-3, HTML as the outputs
  - SVG line art (black and white) allowed
  - Non-ASCII characters allowed

## RFC Format Project Update

- Several moving parts must align; RPC is still targeting end of August to be ready to publish v3 docs
  - Tools and end-to-end process may not be ready
- Expect several months of debugging and increased workload during the implementation phase

## **SLA Update**

- LLC Board has approved (temporary) two additional editors – search in progress
- C238 remaining two docs scheduled for the IESG telechat 8 August 2019
- Format implementation expected Q3 2019
- Exception to the SLA to be requested for Q3 and Q4 2019

# RFC Production Center (RPC) Satisfaction Survey

- Experiment started 1 February 2019; survey revised 1 June 2019
- Purpose: vendor evaluation
- v1 survey (yes/no survey)
  - "Did the editing service provided by the RFC Editor improve the quality your document?" - 98.18% positive response
- v2 survey (1-5 scale)
  - 36.36% "significantly better" (5)
  - 63.64% "better" (4)
- Response rate approx. 17% of authors, doc shepherds polled

  - RFC Format specifications published (RFCs 7991-7998) (2016)
  - Digital archive partnerships (RFC 8153) (2017)
  - New RFC Format rolling out (2019)

# Appointments

Russ Housley and Barry Leiba reappointed to the Community Coordination Group for the 2019-2021 term.

Richard Barnes will serve a second term on the ISOC board.

Jim Reid has been re-appointed to the ICANN RZERC.

The IAB is also currently seeking <u>community feedback for the IETF Delegate to the ICANN 2020 NomCom</u>.



## **Documents**

RFC 8546 and RFC 8558 were issued during this period. The IAB has also adopted four internet-drafts:

- Fifty Years of RFCs
- The Harmful Consequences of the Robustness Principle
- Principles for Operation of Internet Assigned Numbers
   Authority (IANA) Registries
- Long-term Viability of Protocol Extension Mechanisms



# Concluding Programs

Both the <u>StackEvo</u> and <u>PrivSec</u> programs have been operating for a number of years and have fulfilled their initial goals.

Each was the evolution of previous groups (the IP evolution program and the Privacy and Security programs, respectively). While work in related areas will no doubt continue, the IAB plans to conclude both groups in the near future and to carry out any future work in other programs or structures.



# Workshops

Design Expectations vs. Deployment Realities (DEDR) over June 4-5, 2019, hosted by Nokia. Among the issues for exploration are the architectural changes implied in functionality moving into applications and up the stack.

Exploring Synergy between Content Aggregation and the Publisher Ecosystem (ESCAPE) was hosted at Cisco last week to discuss Web Packaging and other options in the space of web content distribution, with a particular emphasis on the secondary effects of those mechanisms.



# and the Internet society

A number of members of the IAB participated in the Internet Society's workshop updating its description of the Internet Invariants.

The IAB has also been consulting with ISOC on its Consolidation activity, raised in the Global Internet Report 2019.



# and the RFC Series Editor search

We regret how things have transpired and we wish to engage in an open discussion about how we can move forward.

#### **Detailed Update: Secretariat Services RFP**

- Originally the main contract was set to expire October 31, 2019. We wanted more time to work on the RFP, for responses, and contracting so extended the contract to December 31, 2019.
- Over time, several services have been added onto the AMS contract:
  - Meeting Services
  - Clerical Services
  - IT Support Services
  - Accounting & Financial Support Services
  - ANRW Event Support Services
- We believe bundling so many services into one contract is unnecessarily complicated & plan to simplify



### **Detailed Update: Executive Director Search**

- We received 134 applications!!
- On 3 July 2019 we met to narrow down from 134 candidates to a shorter list for further assessment
- Interviews and other assessments are conducted by the recruiter (Perrett Laver)
- On 30 July 2019 we will meet to review assessments of the short list of candidates
- In August to September 2019 we will conduct final interviews and assessments and select a final candidate
- August December 2019 (or beyond): Contracting, employee on-boarding, and work transition as needed



#### **Detailed Update: Policies Consultation**

- We began the consultation on 11 June 2019
- Project created on <u>GitHub</u> and new <u>mailing list</u> created
- Conducted <u>webinar</u>
- Four week community comment period was open: 19 June 16 July 2019
- Starting 17 July 2019, we will review all comments and make necessary revisions
- If necessary, the consultation process may need to be repeated (depends on the comments)
- We are also studying minor changes to the Privacy Policy to cover data collected during the Executive Director search.
- Eventually:
  - Formal adoption
  - Posting on the website and appropriate footers
  - Establish a training & compliance program to put the policies into force


# The RFC Editor Model
