- Still working.

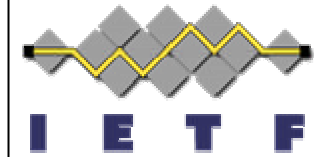




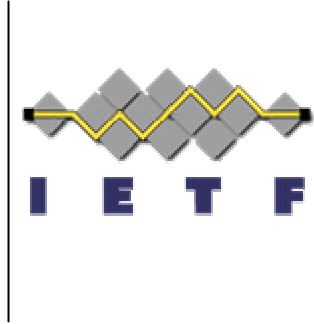
Important events (to me)

- The IPR RFCs are published: RFC 3667, 3688, 3669
 - XML2RFC updated (ver 1.22)
- The Nomcom document has been approved
- The Problem Statement document has been approved
- The ICAR and NEWTRK WGs are created
- Further change discussions tomorrow

Document Actions and RFCs since Minneapolis



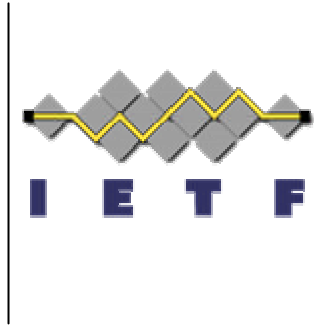
- In 4 months: approx 126 documents approved (15 per telechat)
- RFCs 3606-3710 (approx 100)
 - IPR documents (3667-3669)
 - OSPF-TE (3630)
 - DNSSEC DS (3658)
 - IPSec with AES (3686)
 - Tons of smaller documents
 - .sex considered harmful (3675)
- Proactive followup on "old" documents



Future meetings

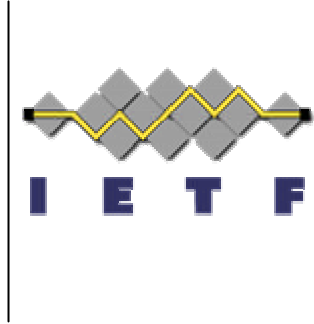
- Summer IETF: San Diego, USA

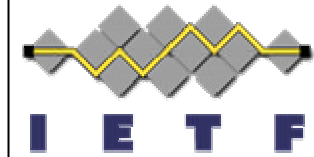
