Issues

- Extensibility of ASN.1
 - We defer to the extensibility mechanisms defined in ASN.1 (we don't want to add our own semantics)
 - If needed, future documents can iron out registration issues.
- Update with recommended connection terminology
 - Will post a summary of individual changes

Issues (cont.)

- Removing some imperatives
 - Referral following (removed MUSTs instructing clients how to consume fields)
- Commonize adherence to data model text.

Issues (cont.)

- Result code for invalidated associations
 - Need text suggesting Notice of Disconnection?
 - Need to prescribe a specific error?
- Undo some changes to strongAuthRequired in regards to Notice of Disconnection

Going forward
