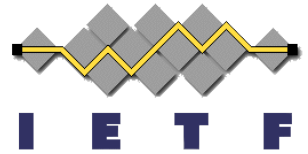
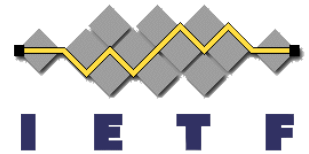


# Architectural argument for another prefix

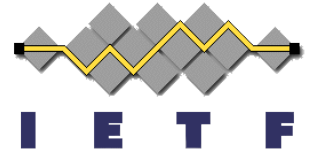




# RFC 1918

- If the prefix is used to address private networks, and therefore free public address space for use in a network,
  - Note that this was the intended use of the RFC 1918 address space: NATs had not been invented

# If the address space is used for CGN:



- Assume networks “south” of the CGN are NAT’ d and use RFC 1918 address space
- To route between address spaces, they have to have separate addresses.
- Therefore,  $?.?.?.?/??$  Cannot be an RFC 1918 address
