A short history

- 3530 was published in April 2004
- 3530bis started in 2009
- 3530bis went to IESG in 2013
 - draft 25
- Gen-ART raised some valid issues
 - Internationalization was a deal breaker

What needed to be done?

- Internationalization
- Kerberos
- Migration

What was done?

- Migration
 - Pulled out 5661 specific text
- Kerberos
 - Modernized with 5661 wording
 - Use what is currently recommended
- Internationalization
 - Focused on running code

Where are we now?

- draft 32 has the i18n changes
- Still had some nits from Gen-ART
 - Draft 33 addresses them
- Will always have nits
 - Large document
 - 10 years since first published
 - Multiple authors and editors
- It does clarify and improve the base RFC 3530
