# **SLIM WG Charter (Approved!)**




- Full text: <a href="http://tools.ietf.org/wg/slim/charters">http://tools.ietf.org/wg/slim/charters</a>
- Two specific use cases:
  - Email where different recipients require different languages.
  - Real-time communication where one party wishes to accommodate people with varying language and media needs.
- The group's initial focus will not be on supporting language-based call routing decisions.
- Goals and Milestones:
  - Mar 2016: Submit "Multiple Language Content Type" to the IESG
  - Mar 2016: Submit "Negotiating Human Language in Real-Time Communications" to the IESG

#### Not in the SLIM WG Charter



- A document covering security/privacy issues arising from inclusion of human language (and other personal information) within SIP/SDP.
- This document can be AD-sponsored (assuming authors can be solicited to write it).
- Brian Rosen (and others) have pointed out that the security/privacy conditions are fairly well understood.
