


Zenzeleni Networks Initial Stages

- Charging phones at ½ the price they paid
- Break out calls from the 12 public phones and VoIP at ½ the current price
- Internal calls among public phones (free of charge)









Zenzeleni Networks Current Status and Future Plans

- Incorporated an non-profit Umbrella Organization to provide services to CNs
 - Licenses
 - Training
 - Procurement
 - Default terms and Conditions
 - Access to wholesale pricing
 - Access to RIR resources
 - Mail box and call centre / Interface in English for official purposes
 - Governing the commons
